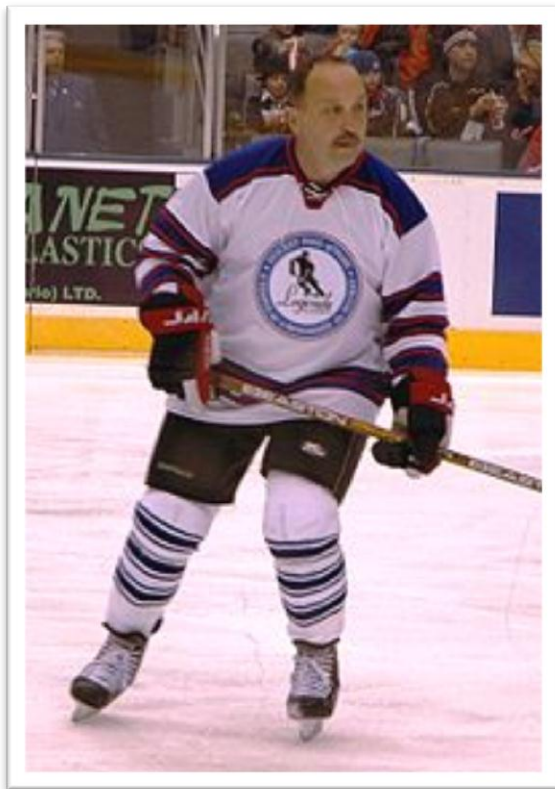




BRYAN TROTTIER

Six-time Stanley Cup champion Bryan Trottier has joined the Road Hockey To Conquer Cancer team!.

Bryan Trottier's sensational 18-season NHL career began with the Calder Trophy as the NHL's top rookie in 1976, and went on to include four consecutive Stanley Cup championships with the New York Islanders (1980-1984) and two straight Cup victories with the Pittsburgh Penguins (1991, 1992). A perennial All-Star, other career highlights for Brian include winning the Art Ross Trophy as the NHL's scoring leader as well as the Hart Trophy as the league's MVP in 1979, the Conn Smythe Trophy as playoff MVP in 1980 and the King Clancy Trophy for leadership and dedication to his community in 1989. Following his superb career, Bryan Trottier was elected to the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1997, and won yet another Stanley

Cup championship, this time, as an assistant coach with the Colorado Avalanche in 2001.
