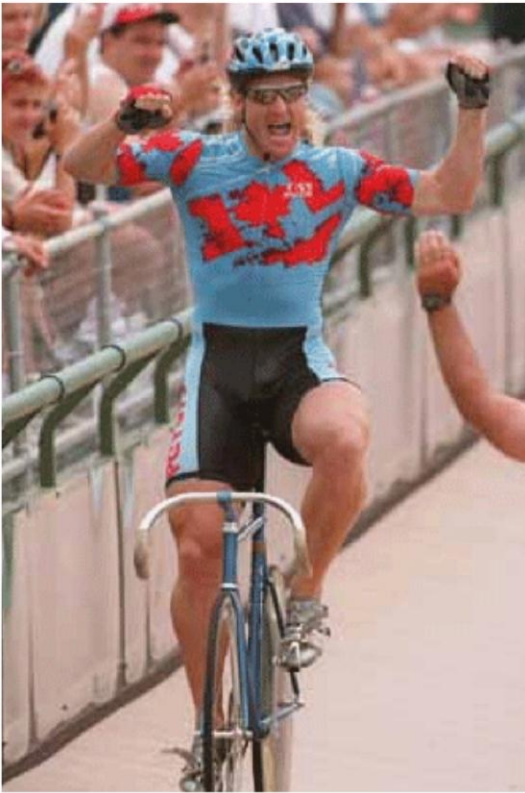




CURT HARNETT

Olympic cycling medalist Curt Harnett has joined the Road Hockey to Conquer Cancer team!

Using cycling as a way to stay in shape for hockey, Curt Harnett realized that he had great potential in the sport, and within two years, was competing for Canada at the 1984 Olympic Summer Games in Los Angeles, claiming a silver medal in the 1,000-metre Time Trial. After finishing tenth in the Match Sprint at the 1988 Summer Olympics, Curt returned to the podium with a bronze medal win in that event at the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona and matched that effort with a bronze in the Match Sprint at the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta. In 1995, Curt established the World Record of 9.865 seconds in the 200-metres, a record he held for eleven years. In 2005, Harnett was inducted into Canada's Sports Hall of Fame. In 2006, he entered the Canadian Olympic Hall of Fame.
