Maple Leaf All-Star Gary Leeman has joined the Road Hockey to Conquer Cancer team!

Gary Leeman began his NHL career on defence after a highly successful junior career at that position, but was converted to a forward with terrific results. Joining the Toronto Maple Leafs during the playoffs in 1982-83, Leeman was later part of Toronto's outstanding Hound Line with Wendel Clark and Russ Courtnall, all three having played with the Athol Murray College of Notre Dame Hounds from Wilcox, Saskatchewan. In 1989-90, Gary earned 95 points and became only the second Leaf (Rick Vaive was first) to score 50 goals in a season, and earned a trip to the NHL All-Star Game as a

result. In January 1992, Gary was traded to Calgary as part of the deal that brought Doug Gilmour to Toronto. During the following season, he was traded to the Montreal Canadiens, and was part of the 1993 Stanley Cup championship. After a stint in Vancouver, Gary Leeman concluded his NHL career with the St. Louis Blues, and through 667 regular season NHL contests, scored 199 goals and assisted on 267 more for a total of 466 points.
