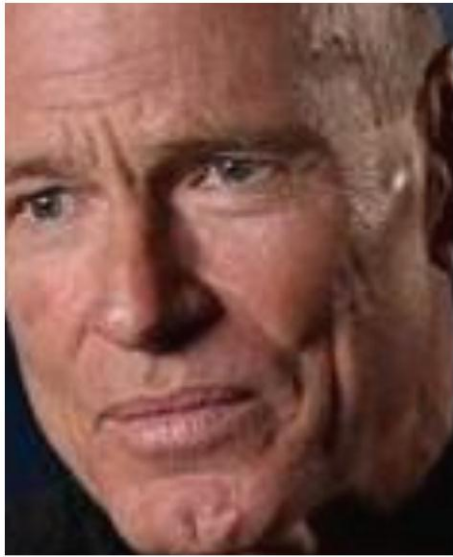
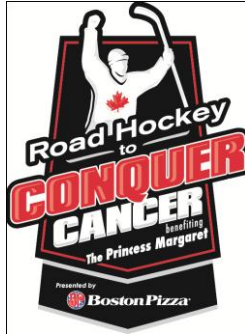




JIM McKENNY

Jim McKenny, former Toronto Maple Leaf and Toronto broadcaster, has joined the Road Hockey to Conquer Cancer team!

Touted as a 'can't miss' junior prospect, Jim was drafted by the Toronto Maple Leafs 17th overall in the 1963 NHL Amateur Draft. While he made his NHL debut in 1965-66, he didn't join the Leafs full-time until 1969-70, but for eight seasons, was a top defenceman for the Leafs. In May 1978, he was traded to the Minnesota North Stars, but played but 10 games before retiring. In 604 regular season NHL games, Jim collected 329 points. In 1971, McKenny appeared in the movie 'Face Off' (loosely based on his life story) as a skating stand-in for actor Art Hindle. Following his hockey career, Jim turned to broadcasting, including Q107 Radio and

CITY-TV, where he carved out a long career as the reputable and amusing late evening sports anchor.
