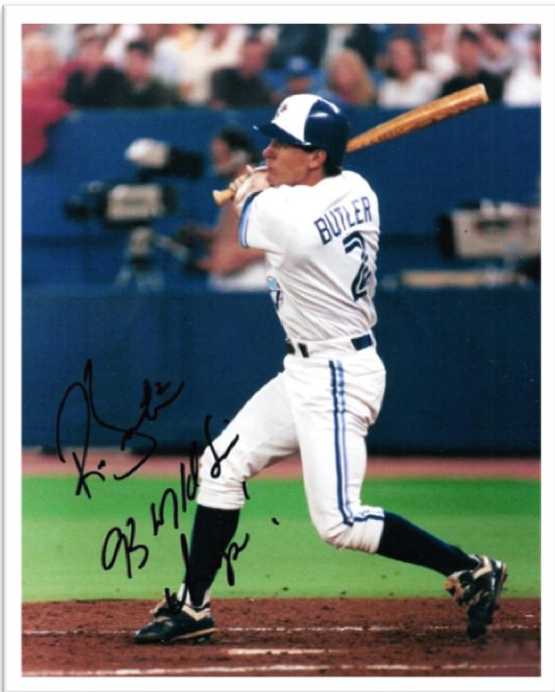




ROB BUTLER

Rob Butler, a member of the World Series champion Toronto Blue Jays, has joined the Road Hockey To Conquer Cancer team!

A Toronto native, the dreams of both Rob and the city came true when he signed with the Blue Jays in September 1990. He made his debut with the club in June 1993, and later that fall, Butler and the Blue Jays won the World Series championship over the Philadelphia Phillies. For the Blue Jays, it was their second consecutive championship; for Rob, his first, but it made him the only Canadian player to have won a World Series with the Toronto Blue Jays. After another season with Toronto, Rob was traded to the Phillies in December 1994. He returned to the Blue Jays for the 1999 season. In 2001, Rob and his brother Rich joined the semi-pro

Toronto Maple Leafs Baseball Club of the Intercounty Baseball League. Through five years, he was regularly the team's batting leader. In 2002, the Maple Leafs went undefeated and won the Jack and Lynne Dominico Trophy as league champions. In 2009, Rob Butler joined the Canadian National Junior Team as a coach.
